1. SAFETY

1.1. ELECTRICAL SAFETY

■ **WARNING!** It is the user's responsibility to check the following:

Check all electrical equipment and appliances to ensure that they are safe before using. Inspect power supply leads, plugs and all electrical connections for wear and damage. Sealey recommend that an RCD (Residual Current Device) is used with all electrical products. You may obtain an RCD by contacting your local Sealey stockist.

If the used in the course of business duties, it must be maintained in a safe condition and routinely PAT (Portable Appliance Test) tested.

Electrical safety information, it is important that the following information is read and understood.

- Ensure that the insulation on all cables and on the appliance is safe before connecting it to the power supply.
- Regularly inspect power supply cables and plugs for wear or damage and check all connections to ensure that they are secure.
- Ensure that the voltage rating on the appliance suits the power supply to be used and that the plug is fitted with the correct fuse see fuse rating in these instructions.
- **DO NOT** pull or carry the appliance by the power cable.
- DO NOT pull the plug from the socket by the cable. Remove the plug from the socket by maintaining a firm grip on the plug.
- DO NOT use worn or damaged cables, plugs or connectors. Ensure that any faulty item is repaired or replaced immediately by a qualified electrician.

This product is fitted with a BS1363/A 13 Amp 3 pin plug.

If the cable or plug is damaged during use, switch off the electricity supply and remove from use. Replace a damaged plug with a BS1363/A 13 Amp 3 pin plug. If in doubt contact a qualified electrician. Class II products are wired with live (brown) and neutral (blue) only are marked with the Class II symbol;

- A) Connect the BROWN live wire to the live terminal 'L'.
- B) Connect the BLUE neutral wire to the neutral terminal 'N'.
- C) After wiring, check that there are no bare wires and ensure that all wires have been correctly connected.


Ensure that the cable outer sheath extends inside the cable restraint and that the restraint is tight.

DO NOT connect either wire to the earth terminal.

Sealey recommend that repairs are carried out by a qualified electrician.

1.2. BATTERY CHARGER SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- □ WARNING! DO NOT use the charging base to charge any battery other than that required for the tool. Other types of batteries may explode!
- ✓ Inspect the plug, cable and the charging base for wear and damage to ensure items are safe before connecting to the mains power supply. If worn or damaged **DO NOT** use, immediately replace, or contact a qualified electrician.
- ✓ Check cables are always protected against short circuit and overload.
- \checkmark Uncoil the power cable between the plug and the charging base before use.
 - DO NOT pull or carry the charging base by the charger power lead, or pull the plug from the mains socket by the power lead.
- **DO NOT** use any other type of transformer with the charging base.
- DO NOT try to open or dis-assemble the plug or charging base.
- **DO NOT** use the plug to power any other electrical item.
- Disconnect the charging base from the mains power supply when not in use.

- ✓ Charge battery prior to its first use. The battery will have been shipped in a low charge state. To reduce the risk of burns or fire:
- **DO NOT** Attempt to open, disassemble, modify or service the battery pack.
- **DO NOT** Crush, puncture, short external contacts or dispose of in fire or water.
- **DO NOT** Expose to temperatures above 40°C (104°F).
- Replace only with the battery pack designated for this product.
- Use only the charging base provided to charge the grinder battery.

- ✓ Maintain the riveter in good condition (use an authorised service agent).
- Replace or repair damaged parts. Use genuine parts only. Unauthorised parts may be dangerous and will invalidate the warranty.
- ✓ Keep the work area clean, uncluttered and ensure that there is adequate lighting.
- ✓ Keep the riveter clean for best and safest performance.
- □ WARNING! Always wear approved eye or face protection when operating the riveter.
- Maintain correct balance and footing. Ensure the floor is not slippery and wear non-slip shoes.

2. INTRODUCTION

Suitable for aluminium, steel and stainless steel rivets from 2.4 to 5.0mm. Powered by a 20V 2Ah Lithium-ion battery with a pulling force of up to 9000N. Four selectable power settings help preserve battery by only supplying the force required. LED battery level indicator. Four riveting nozzles, 2.4mm, 3.2mm, 4.0mm and 5.0mm. Supplied in durable plastic storage case with mains charger and 2Ah battery.

4. OPERATION

4.1. BATTERY REMOVAL/ INSTALLATION

- 4.1.1. Always be aware of the condition of the riveter before insertion or removal of the battery cartridge.
- 4.2. BATTERY REMOVAL
- 4.2.1. Hold the handle tightly and push the battery latch to remove the battery.
- WARNING! Never short circuit the battery.

4.3. BATTERY INSTALLATION


4.3.1. To insert the battery cartridge, align the tongue on the battery cartridge with the groove in the housing and slip into place. Always insert it all the way until it locks in place with a little click.

Note: Prior to operation prepare and check the work environment, make sure the work site meets all the conditions laid out in the precautions.

4.4. CHECKING THE BATTERY

4.4.1. Make sure that the battery is installed firmly.

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
4.5. USING THE RIVET GUN


4.5.1. Insert the rivet stem as far as possible into the riveter nozzle (fig.2).

4.6. AUTOMATIC MODE

NOTE: Always use the riveter in automatic mode. To select automatic mode push the mode selection switch to the left (fig.1.6)

- 4.6.1. According to the size of rivet, adjust for the length of the rivet as follows;
 - Fig.1.1: reduce the length of rivet, which is suitable for short rivet riveting.
 - Fig.1.3: increase the length of rivet, which is suitable for long rivet riveting.
 - Fig.1.4: If one green light is on, it means the riveting mode is on for first position (shortest length for riveting); When all four lights are on it means it is set in the longest riveting position.
- 4.6.2. Pull the trigger to pull the rivet up. Keep the trigger depressed until the rivet stem is heard to snap away from the head (fig.2 and fig.3).
- 4.6.3. At this point, release the trigger; the machine will reverse automatically and release the stem.
- 4.6.4. When the user presses button 1 and then the trigger the riveter will be in automatic mode.






5. MAINTENANCE

- **5.1.** Before using the tools, charge the battery as follows.
- 5.1.1. Plug the battery charger (fig.4.3). The charging light will light up green (fig.4.2).
- 5.1.2. Insert the battery cartridge (fig.4.1) so that the plus and minus terminals on the battery cartridge are on the same side as their respective markings on the charger.
- 5.1.3. When the battery cartridge is inserted fully, the charging light (fig.4.2) will flash green and charging will begin.
- 5.1.4. When the charging light changes to from green flashing to solid green (fig.4.2), the charging cycle is complete.
- 5.1.5. After charging, unplug the charger from the power source.
 - **WARNING!** The battery charger is for the original battery cartridge. Never use it for other purposes or for other manufacturers batteries.
- 5.1.6. When you charge a battery cartridge which is new or has not been charged for a long period of time, it may not accept a full charge until after discharging it completely and recharging it a couple of times.
- 5.1.7. If you charge a battery from a just operated tool or a battery which has been exposed to direct sunlight or heat for a long time, the charging light will turn red. Let the battery cool before charging.



6.1. If a rivet gets stuck in the riveter, switch the riveter from automatic to manual mode a couple of times. This should free the stuck rivet.





ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION
