1. SAFETY

1.1. GENERAL

- x **DO NOT** shine directly into your, other person's or animal's eyes.
- x **DO NOT** allow children to use the inspection lamp.
- x **DO NOT** handle or move the inspection lamp whilst it is being charged.
- x **DO NOT** use the inspection lamp if you suspect that the battery or the inspection lamp casing is damaged.
- x **DO NOT** leave battery in a discharged state: recharge battery immediately. If the inspection lamp is not in use, recharge the battery every 3 to 4 weeks.

1.2. ELECTRICAL SAFETY FOR USE OF CHARGER.

USE ONLY THE SUPPLIED CHARGER PLUG FOR CONNECTING INSPECTION LAMP TO THE POWER SUPPLY.

WARNING! It is the user's responsibility to read, understand and comply with the following electrical instructions: You must ensure the risk of electric shock is minimised by the installation of appropriate safety devices. An RCCB (Residual Current Circuit Breaker) should be incorporated in the main distribution board. We also recommend that an RCD (Residual Current Device) is used with all electrical products, particularly portable equipment which is plugged into an electrical supply not protected by an RCCB.

You must also read and understand the instructions concerning electrical safety paragraph 1.3.1 onwards.

1.3.1. The Electricity At Work Act 1989 requires all portable electrical appliances, if used on business premises, to be tested by a qualified electrician, using a Portable Appliance Tester (PAT), at least once a year.

1.3.2. The Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 makes owners of electrical appliances responsible for the safe condition of the appliance and the safety of the appliance operator. **If in any doubt, contact a qualified electrician.**

1.3.3. You must ensure that you:

- ✓ Inspect the charger plug, cable and connector for wear and damage to ensure items are safe before connecting to the mains power supply. If worn or damaged **DO NOT** use.
- ✓ Important: Check that the voltage marked on the charger plug is the same as the power supply to be used.
- ✓ Uncoil the cable between charger and the inspection lamp.
- x **DO NOT** pull the charger plug from the mains socket by the lead.
- x **DO NOT** use any other type of charger with this inspection lamp.
- x **DO NOT** try to take the charger plug apart.
- x **DO NOT** use the charger plug to charge or power any other electrical item.
- x **DO NOT** get the charger wet, or use in wet, damp conditions (for indoor use only).
- WARNING! NEVER** substitute a standard 13amp 3 pin plug, or any other type of plug, for the charger plug.

2. INTRODUCTION

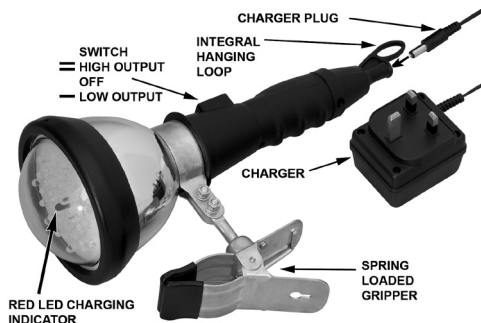

3. CHARGING

IMPORTANT WARRANTY INFORMATION:

The battery fitted to this cordless tool is considered to be a consumable item and its ability to accept charge will reduce over time. We will warranty it against mechanical and electrical defect for a period of one year - this does not cover fair wear and tear. If the battery is not properly charged before first use, or regularly conditioned, its capacity will diminish. Under these circumstances we will not replace the battery even if it is less than one year old.

- 3.1 Make sure the inspection lamp is switched off before commencing charging.
- 3.2 Uncoil the charging lead and plug the connector into the charging socket built into the end of the inspection lamp handle.



- 3.3 Plug the charger into a 230V mains supply.
- 3.4 The red LED in the centre of the lense will illuminate to indicate that charging is in progress.
- 3.5 The lamp will take 14 hours to fully charge. Do not continue charging beyond this period.
- 3.6 Unplug the charger from the mains supply. Unplug the charging lead from the inspection lamp.
- 3.7 The inspection lamp will operate continuously for seven hours on the low output setting and three and a half hours on the high output setting.
- 3.8 Charger Part No: **LED28.C**.

4. OPERATION

- 4.2 Mount the lamp to a secure position using the spring loaded gripper. Do not clamp over electrical wiring or onto any vehicle components that move. To suspend the inspection lamp, use the hanging loop at the end of the handle.
- 4.1 **DIRECT THE LENS AWAY FROM YOUR EYES BEFORE SWITCHING ON.** The lamp has a three position rocker switch. The centre position is OFF. Moving the switch to the single bar position turns the lamp onto LOW output. Moving the switch to the double bar position turns the lamp onto HIGH output.

Note: LED arrays are designed to allow individual LEDs to cease functioning without causing the entire array to fail. This could be as a result of shock or impact. Shock or impact will invalidate warranty.

Environmental Protection

Battery Removal



- WARNING!** Ensure the lamp is not connect to the charger when removing the battery.
- 1. Remove the gripper from its clamp using a large cross head screwdriver and the correct size socket.
- 2. With the gripper removed, unscrew the 2 screws on the head of the lamp and 3 screws on the rear of the handle.
- 3. Slide the handle away from the head of the lamp and remove one side of the handle.
- 4. Cut each wire that connects to the battery pack.

Dispose of batteries according to local authority guidelines.
