1. SAFETY

1.1. GENERAL

- ▲ Ensure the lamp is fully charged before initial use.
- × **DO NOT** turn the lamp on when it is being charged.
- × **DO NOT** shine directly into your, another person's or an animal's eyes.
- × **DO NOT** allow children to use the lamp.
- × **DO NOT** handle or move the lamp whilst it is being charged.
- × **DO NOT** use the lamp if you suspect that the battery or the lamp casing is damaged.
- × **DO NOT** leave battery in a discharged state, recharge battery immediately. Before storage, fully recharge the battery, subsequently recharge the battery at least once every six months of non-use.

1.2. ELECTRICAL SAFETY FOR USE OF CHARGER.

USE ONLY THE SUPPLIED CHARGER PLUG FOR CONNECTING LAMP TO THE POWER SUPPLY.

- **WARNING!** It is the user's responsibility to read, understand and comply with the following electrical instructions:
You must ensure the risk of electric shock is minimised by the installation of appropriate safety devices.
An RCCB (Residual Current Circuit Breaker) should be incorporated in the main distribution board. We also recommend that an RCD (Residual Current Device) is used with all electrical products, particularly portable equipment which is plugged into an electrical supply not protected by an RCCB.

You must also read and understand the following instructions concerning electrical safety.

- 1.2.1. The Electricity At Work Act 1989 requires all portable electrical appliances, if used on business premises, to be tested by a qualified electrician, using a Portable Appliance Tester (PAT), at least once a year.
- 1.2.2. The Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 makes owners of electrical appliances responsible for the safe condition of the appliance and the safety of the appliance operator. If in any doubt about electrical safety, contact a qualified electrician.
- 1.2.3. You must ensure that you: Inspect the charger plug, cable and connector for wear and damage to ensure items are safe before connecting to the mains power supply.
 - 1.2.1. If worn or damaged **DO NOT** use.
 - ▲ **IMPORTANT:** Check that the voltage marked on the charger plug is the same as the lamp.
 - 1.2.2. Uncoil the cable between charger and the lamp.
 - × **DO NOT** pull the charger plug from the mains socket by the lead.
 - **WARNING! DO NOT** use any other type of charger with this product, other than the supplied mains or 12V in car charger. Failure to observe this warning could result in injury and or fire and will invalidate the warranty.
 - × **DO NOT** try to take the charger plug apart.
 - × **DO NOT** use the charger plug to charge or power any other electrical item.
 - × **DO NOT** get the charger wet, or use in wet, damp conditions (for indoor use only).

1.3. BATTERY SAFETY

- **WARNING!** To reduce the risk of burns or fire:
 - × **DO NOT** attempt to open, disassemble, modify or service the battery pack.
 - × **DO NOT** crush, puncture, short external contacts or dispose of in fire or water.
 - × **DO NOT** expose to temperatures above 60°C (140°).
- 1.3.1. Replace only with the battery pack designated for this product.
- 1.3.2. Recycle or dispose of used battery as stipulated by local regulation.
- 1.3.3. If the electrolyte in the cells gets on your skin, thoroughly wash with soap and water. If it gets in your eyes, rinse thoroughly with cool water and seek immediate medical attention.

2. INTRODUCTION

Composite casing with a comfortable ergonomic hand grip. Features 6 super bright SMD LEDs producing up to 200 lumens. Fitted with a hanging hook and a rear mounted magnet for hands free operation. Powered by a 3.7V 1.5Ah rechargeable Li-ion battery which lasts up to 3.5 hours. Charge indicator turns green when fully charged. Supplied with 12V in- car charger and mains charger

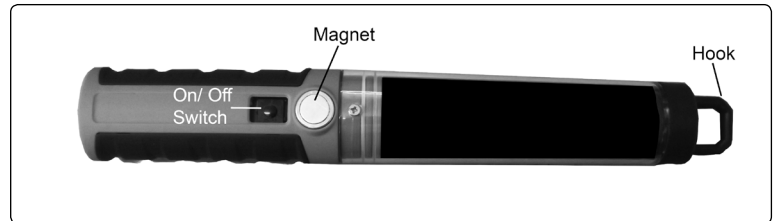
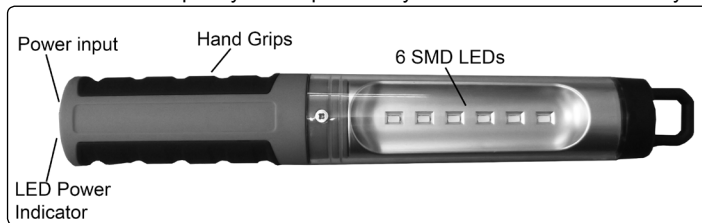
▲ **IMPORTANT WARRANTY INFORMATION**

The battery fitted to this lamp is considered to be a consumable item and its ability to accept a charge will reduce over time. We will provide warranty against mechanical and electrical defect for a period of one year - this does not cover fair wear and tear. If the battery is not properly charged before first use, or regularly conditioned, its capacity will diminish. Under these circumstances we will not replace the battery regardless of whether it is less than one year old.

Note: The lithium battery does not suffer from memory effect and once fully charged may be stored for up to six months without another charge.

4. OPERATION

- 4.1. Connect the lead to the socket on the base of the lamp. Plug into power supply and turn on, the charging LED on the lamp will show red showing charging has commenced.
- 4.2. When the battery has charged fully the LED will show green
- 4.3. Direct the lens away from your eyes before switching on.
- 4.4. Switch the lamp on by using the ON/OFF switch.
- 4.5. The lamp may be suspended by the hook or attached to any ferrous surface by using the magnets.

Battery Removal

Remove the two screws holding plastic lens cover, pull lens cover from handle do not pull internal wires. Remove the two hand grips, followed by the 4 screws on the lamp. Prise casing apart. Remove the battery. Dispose of according to local government guidelines.
