

PARAFFIN SPRAY GUN - LARGE INLET

1. SAFETY

- ✓ Familiarise yourself with the application, limitations and potential hazards peculiar to the paraffin spray gun.
- **WARNING!** Disconnect the gun from the air supply before servicing or performing any maintenance.
- ✓ Maintain the gun in good condition (use an authorised service agent).
- Replace or repair damaged parts. Use recommended parts only. Unauthorised parts may be dangerous and will invalidate the warranty.
- ✓ Keep the gun clean for best and safest performance.
- ✓ Ensure that the compressed air system can supply the gun.
- \checkmark Wear approved safety respiratory protection and safety eye goggles.
- ✓ Remove ill-fitting clothing. Remove ties, watches, rings and other loose jewellery and tie back long hair.
- Locate the gun in a suitable work area. Keep area clean and tidy and free from unrelated materials and ensure that there is adequate ventilation and lighting.
- ✓ Keep children and unauthorised persons away from the work area.
- \checkmark When not in use, ensure that the air supply is turned off.
- ✓ Avoid unintentional operation of the gun.
- **× DO NOT** point the gun at yourself, other persons or animals.
- **× DO NOT** direct air from the air hose at yourself, other persons or animals.
- **DO NOT** carry the gun by the hose, or yank the hose from the air supply.
- **× DO NOT** use the gun for any purpose other than that for which it is designed.
- **× DO NOT** allow untrained persons to operate the gun.
- **DO NOT** get the gun wet or use in damp or wet locations or in areas where there is condensation.
- DO NOT operate the gun if any parts are missing or damaged as this may cause failure and/or personal injury.
- ✓ When not in use, disconnect the gun from the air supply, clean thoroughly and store safely.

2. INTRODUCTION

Metal tank with large diameter fluid aperture which aids filling and cleaning of tank. Suitable for applying degreasing and cleaning agents. Fitted with fluid/air control valve.

3. SPECIFICATION

4. AIR SUPPLY

WARNING! Ensure the air supply is clean and does not exceed 116psi while operating the spray gun. Too high an air pressure will shorten the product life and may be dangerous causing damage or personal injury.

4.1. Air Supply

- (Recommended hook-up procedure is shown in fig.1).
- 4.2. Ensure the gun air valve (trigger) is in the off position before connecting to the air supply.
- 4.3. Drain the air supply tank daily. Water in the air line will ruin the paint finish and damage the spray gun.
- 4.4. Clean air inlet filter weekly.
- 4.5. Line pressure should be increased to compensate for unusually long air hoses (over 8 metres). The minimum hose diameter should be 1/4" I.D. and fittings must have the same inside dimensions.
- 4.6. Keep hose away from heat, oil and sharp edges. Check hose for wear, and make certain that all connections are secure.

4.7. Couplings

4.7.1. Vibration may cause failure if a quick change coupling is connected directly to the spray gun. To overcome this, connect a leader hose to the spray gun. A quick change coupling may then be used to connect the leader hose to the air line recoil hose. (See fig.1 & 2).


5. OPERATION

- □ WARNING! Ensure you read, understand and apply the safety instructions in section 1 and follow the manufacturer's instructions on the paraffin spray gun.
- 5.1. Screw on the tank full of paraffin.
- 5.2. Ensure the air supply is regulated to no more than (116psi) than attach the leader hose to the gun.
- 5.3. Test for correct operation in a safe area first.

6. MAINTENANCE

WARNING! Ensure the gun is disconnected from the air supply before attempting any internal maintenance.

6.1. After use, remove the partially used or spent tank and empty /clean all components of the gun thoroughly with paraffin and allow to dry before storage.
